# Seafield Courtyard Regulations

## Mausoleum Chambers

### Exclusive Right of Burial

- 1 The Mausoleum Chamber in which the exclusive right of burial has been granted shall be used solely as a burial place for one deceased person and no other use shall be made.
- 2 The deceased must be interred in a hermetically sealed coffin.
- 3 The party in whose favour the right of burial has been granted ["the Proprietor"] (and his/her heirs or successors) may not dispose of or sell this right without our written permission. However, the Proprietor may assign the right as part of their heritable estate.
- 4 In cases where there is no will, the right of burial shall pass to the eldest child. Where there are no children, the eldest representative according to the rules of heritable succession of the Law of Scotland shall succeed.
- 5 No heir (or successor) of the Proprietor shall have any right or interest in the Mausoleum Chamber until he/she has provided satisfactory evidence to the Company.
- 6 The exclusive right of burial will be granted for a period of **seventy five years** or until the Cemetery is no longer used as a burial ground. At the end of this period the heirs or successors of the Proprietor may renew the lease for a period and fee fixed at that time by the Company. If it is not reasonably possible to trace the heirs or successors, or if the heirs or successors decline the option to renew the lease, then the exclusive right of burial in the Mausoleum Chamber shall default to the Company. The Company will then be entitled to apply for permission to exhume the remains and dispose of them in a dignified manner according to the methods of disposal of remains available at that time.

### Erection of Memorials

- 7 No memorial plaque other than that supplied by the Company shall be fixed to the Mausoleum Chamber.
- 8 Any subsequent work to the memorial plaque, or replacement of the memorial plaque, must be instructed through the Company.
- 9 Freshly cut flowers may be placed in the holders provided, but no other memorials may be placed.

### General

- 10 Visitors to the Cemetery and to the Courtyard are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times, and must not be allowed to intimidate other visitors, or the local wildlife. The Superintendent has the right to refuse admission to the Cemetery and to the Courtyard.
- 11 The Proprietor (and his/her heirs or successors) will be bound by such rules and regulations as the Company may from time to time bring into effect.
